




The Cross Through History: The First Thousand Years The Middle Ages Post Reformation

THE FIRST THOUSAND YEARS

The word <u>cross</u> comes from <u>Latin</u> <u>crux</u>, a Roman torture device used for <u>crucifixion</u>. The word was introduced to English in the 10th century as the term for the instrument of the <u>torturous</u> <u>execution of Jesus</u> as described in the <u>New Testament</u>.









FISH IN GREEK IS ICTHUS... Jesus Christ Son of God Savior


ICTHUS means Jesus Christ, Son of God, Savior

- lota (i) is the first letter of <u>lēsous</u> (Ἰησοῦς),
 Greek for "<u>Jesus</u>".
- Chi (c) is the first letter of <u>Christos</u> (Χριστός),
 Greek for "anointed".
- Theta (th) is the first letter of *Theou* (Θεοῦ), Greek for "God's"
- Upsilon (y) is the first letter of (h)uios^[6] (Υἱός),
 Greek for "Son"
- Sigma (s) is the first letter of sōtēr (Σωτήρ),
 Greek for "Savior"


